



Spring/Summer 2010 Projects

Schools Partnership Scheme

The company has developed strong links with several secondary schools across the region of Leeds, delivering our expertise with specially devised workshops to suit the needs of the students within education, and to develop this where possible.

Ralph Thoresby: Phoenix Dance Education delivered a project to work creatively with less able bodied students over the period of five weeks, this project will now be continued throughout the summer term. At the same school we also delivered technique classes to a Yr 11 GCSE group.

Cockburn College of Arts: We are looking to deliver two separate projects at this school, targeting a boys only group who are at risk of exclusion and a BTEC group.

Rodillian High School: A ten week project working with Yr 6 students, working on easing the transition from primary to secondary level, funded by West Yorkshire Sport.

Garforth Community College: For eight weeks during the summer term the company will working on a project targeting 300 Yr 7 students who have received limited dance provision; coinciding with a large performance at Garforth Arts Festival. Funded by West Yorkshire Sport.

Clusters Work

Morley: A project is due to take place in the Morley cluster, targeting 13-16 year olds who have not had much experience in dance. The project will result in each participant obtaining arts award at bronze level and a performance at The Carriage Works.

Alwoodley: Phoenix Dance Education has a range of projects at several primary schools in Alwoodley, looking at creative movement.

Phoenix Youth Academy: 15-19 year olds train twice a week in contemporary technique. Places are subject to audition.

West Yorkshire Youth Dance Platform: In collaboration with West Yorkshire Sport and the youth dance hub, Phoenix Dance Theatre is hosting a celebratory performance event to coincide with Garforth Arts Festival.
